

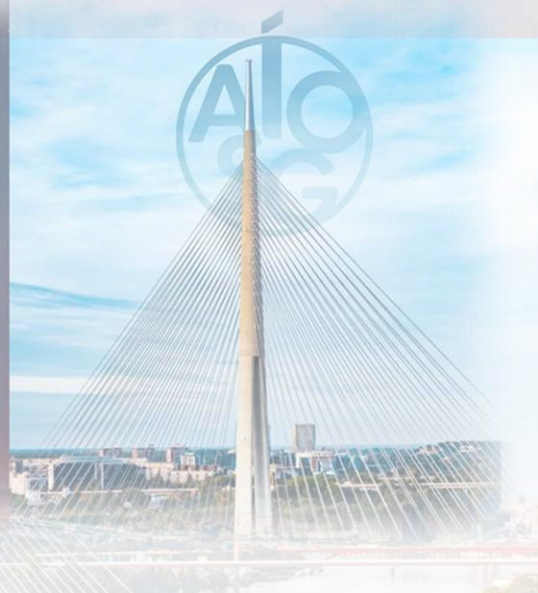
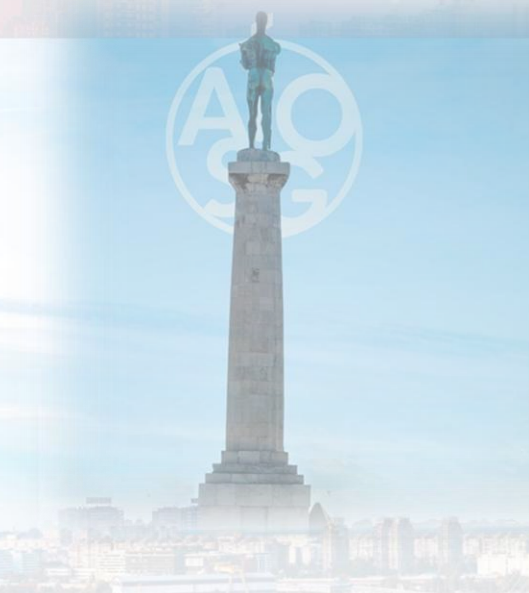

WELCOME MESSAGE


Dear colleagues, dear friends,





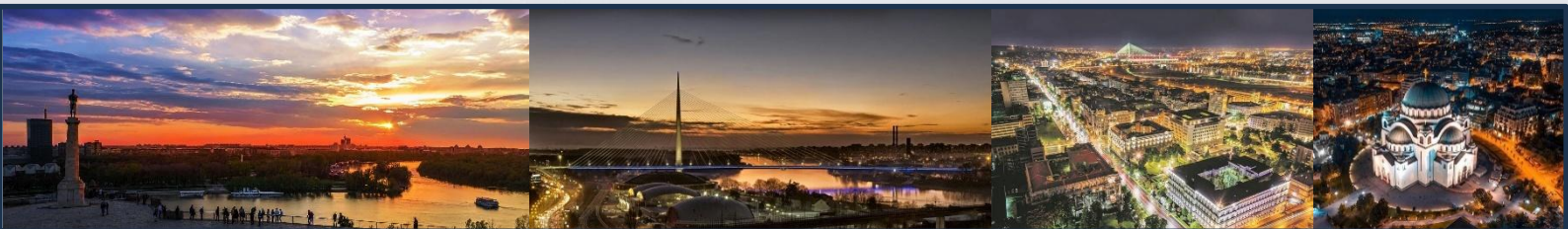

HOST CITY AND VENUE

Belgrade is situated at the confluence of the Sava and Danube rivers, where the Pannonian Plain meets the Balkans. The medieval town of Singidunum, which is the Slavic name of Belgrade known since 878, was built on the site of today's Belgrade Fortress and Kalemegdan Park, above the place where the Sava flows into the Danube. Because of its position, Belgrade is appositely called the Gate to the Balkans and the Gate to Central Europe.

Belgrade is one of the oldest cities in Europe. It has a history of 7000 years, and the oldest archeological finds date back to the fifth millennium AD. Between the 16th and 19th centuries, Belgrade was called by many names in different languages: Alba Bulgarica, Alba Graeca, Bello grado, Nandor Alba, Griechisch Veissenburg and Castelbianco.

Belgrade is the capital of Serbia, and its cultural, scientific and education center. It has the highest concentration of important arts and scientific national institutions: the Serbian Academy of Science and Art, founded in 1886 as the Serbian Royal Academy; the National Library of Serbia, founded in 1832; the National Museum, founded in 1841 and the National Theatre, founded in 1869.

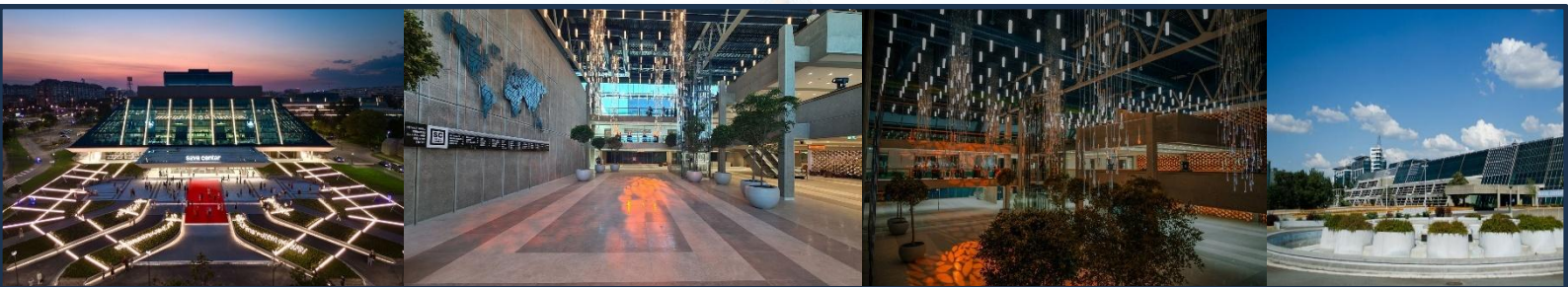

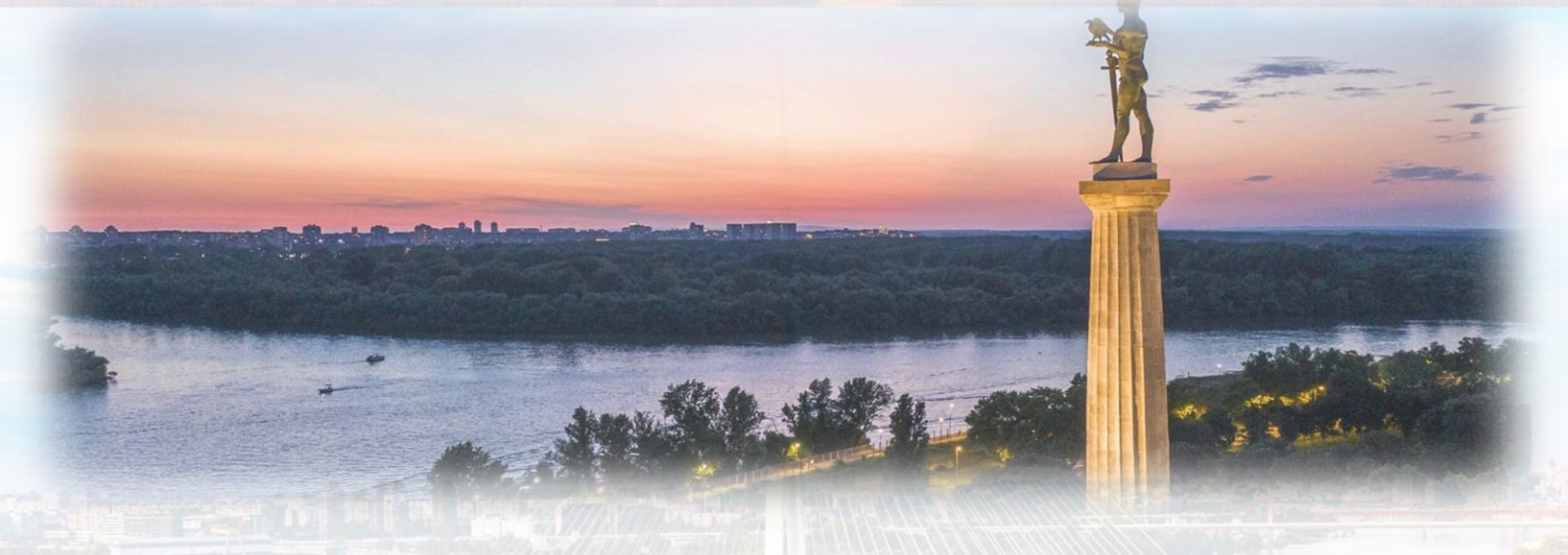
